CONGO – Missionary G.D.

The Lord has greatly blessed throughout 2007. We have 21 churches/satellite churches scattered throughout the Congo. The combined weekly attendance is 1,342. This past year, there were 1,199 professions of faith (adults and children that are being followed up for discipleship) and 217 baptisms. Our two colleges have a combined enrollment of 49 students ranging in ages 25 to 62 years old, and eleven college teachers.

GUATEMALA – Missionary D.C.

We have been able to help a few churches in the area with a variety of activities. Our big yellow van has served us well, transporting people to special services and a youth conference, too. We will be starting a new work this year.

USA - Missionary K.L.

We have a new family that has been coming for the last 2 months that we expect will be joining and also a couple that has been faithfully attending since August that will probably be joining our fellowship as well. We had nine new visitors this last month and we continue to go door to door meeting new people in the community.

URUGUAY – Missionary A.F.

We have been going house-to-house from Tuesday to Friday mornings, checking off the areas on a city map. On Sunday mornings, I go to the city fair where I give out evangelistic literature with the name of the church. We have already received phone calls asking questions.

Indonesia - Missionary S.L.

The ministry is moving forward. We do not have exponential growths like other churches might, but we increased daily. About 200 attend our Sunday morning now, but a part of that is our own orphanage kids and the college students. We are planning for a new auditorium, although not very soon, maybe by next year. Land is expensive here so we have decided to build the new auditorium on our third level. We now have started, through our graduates, seven churches in the greater area here. I just went to preach in one of them where they are meeting in the pastor's rented house, there were 25 people there and quite a few were out of town too, so it was quite crowded. They're already thinking of enlarging it. Another church started by one of our graduates already needs a new place to meet as well. The college is doing well and is always a busy time whenever it's in session. We have promising students with 40 in the dorms and 50-60 enrolled.

CENTRAL MEXICO – Missionary R.H.

We are happy to report that the Lord went before us as we evangelized in six cities in Central Mexico. The mission team, national pastors, and Bible School students went door-to-door and to the plazas where we recorded 114 professions of faith. The church services were Spirit filled as each of us participated including the College students.

HAITI – Missionary L.C.

Our youth retreat held in February was a success with 229 people. The primary school is running 332 students. We are now gearing up for the Summer Bible School and we're hoping to squeeze up to 200 students in our humble facilities.

HONDURAS – Missionary J.T.

There is so much going on, but the most thrilling part came on Tuesday when I met with some of the pastors. One by one they began to stand and tell of the souls that have been saved during this past two months. One stood and said eight were saved in a new area, another reported 8, another reported 10 and another pastor reported 74 souls were saved! From the bottom of my heart, I thank you for being such a blessing to the Lord's work here and for being such a blessing to me and my family. Yes, 2008 may be the year our Lord will come and we will rest from all our labors – but until then we must keep on doing everything we can to win precious souls for our Lord!

BRAZIL – Missionary R.R.

Thank you so much for enabling us to fulfill the Great Commission of Jesus. We baptized 18 new converts (five of them preteens) in March. Four precious souls were saved that day after I preached on eternal security. We are going to hold two major prophetic conferences next month. Ten thousand flyers are being distributed inviting people to attend these meetings. Please pray for the power of God over us and for the salvation of many souls.

INDIA – Missionary T.K.

There were 10 people that made decisions for Christ and 2 have followed through with baptism. The church has raised funds for a back door for the church and is now collecting money to purchase 100 more chairs. We continue to pray for affordable property for the church. The pastor here will be traveling to Bangalore to do research for Kannada and Telugu Bibles, and while he is there he is going to visit several Bible Institutes to see if there is anyone called of God to be a pastor of a Kannada speaking church.

EAST AFRICA – Missionary J.S.

Let me take this opportunity to thank you so much for your precious input in world missions in terms of your love, prayers, and treasure; supporting missionaries around the globe and most especially my family and I here East Africa. We give all glory and honor to God for what He is doing here. The peace and order situation has improved the last two years now and the opportunity to witness is everywhere, but the laborers are few. Please come over and help us! The former evacuation center, which was used during the frequent rebel attacks in 2004, just 50 meters away from our church property, was converted into a technical school. God has given us the privilege to witness there and the school administrator has allowed us to conduct a Bible study with their students every Friday. They are also allowed to attend our church services during Sunday. Over 200 students accepted Christ as their Lord and Saviour! During the month of March, besides young people, we have adult first time visitors every service getting saved, and many more are getting saved through soul winning and visitation. Our prayer is for baptisms to increase.
